Antipsychotic prescribing practices study

Registered Nurses are invited to participate in a study to share your perspectives on antipsychotic prescribing practices for adult patients who are critically ill or have recently experienced critical illness.

Your involvement will include completing an **online** Delphi Process consensus **survey** to rate (based on importance) antipsychotic prescribing and deprescribing practices. This process will include two to three rounds (depending on consensus) of online surveys. Each round is expected to take 20 minutes or less to complete. Your responses will be anonymous and presented in aggregate.

You will have until February 4, 2022 to complete the first survey. You will receive initial access to the survey January 14, 2022. The second round is expected to occur on February 21 to March 4, 2022. You will have two weeks to complete each round.

Nursing Care 101 Back to the Basics

This session will discuss the importance of basic nursing care to improving outcomes with hospitalized patients. We are in unprecedented times during this global pandemic, and even the smallest tasks can make a significant impact in reducing hospital-acquired infections.
