

Registration for the <u>ECHO Critical Care Nurse Well-Being</u> program has opened for Critical Care Nurses across Ontario! This free program aims to promote resilience, connection, and wellness at a time that many are experiencing isolation, burnout, and stress.

How does it work? Critical care nurses practicing in Ontario can register for the program using the link below. Once registered, participants will receive a zoom link to join the sessions. Each session includes a short didactic talk on a relevant topic and interactive discussion and conversation focused on nurses' experiences related to this topic. Participants can register for the program and drop in on sessions that work for their schedule – they do not have to attend all sessions.

The guidelines will also be critically analyzed and compared to the guidelines from the Canadian Critical Care Society to identify knowledge and process gaps, and to improve end-of-life care for patients and families in Critical Care settings.
