

Cardiovascular & Critical Care Nursing: Connections to Care

The CJCN & CJCCN are pleased to announce the call for papers for a special collaborative theme issue on cardiovascular and critical care nursing.

We invite researchers, clinicians, educators, and administrators to consider submitting short reports on novel research projects, clinical/practice, education, or administrative-related topics related to cardiovascular and critical care. Accepted papers will be published in a theme issue of the CJCN & CJCCN.

- Deadline for submissions: June 1, 2024.
- Criteria for all submissions: <u>Page limit</u>: max 15 double-spaced pages [including title page]; <u>Abstract</u>: max 200 words; APA 7th ed.
- For all other submission criteria, follow the author guidelines for <u>CJCN</u> <u>or CJCCN</u> for research/non-research papers (note: specify which guidelines were followed in the cover letter).
- Potential topic areas common to cardiovascular and critical care nurses:
 - Case reports
 - QA projects
 - Advanced cardiac assessment
 - Advanced/novel arrythmias?
 - Advanced organ support
 - Support/initiatives for inclusion of family
 - Specific initiatives or research directed toward care of diverse populations.
 - Novel models of care across the continuum.
