The associate editors are supported by two co-Editors, a paid Managing Editor and a team of international advisory board members and peer reviewers.

The *International Journal of Critical Care* endeavours to be a truly global vehicle for sharing the latest research, initiatives, policy advice, and achievements in critical care. The journal is open access and is provided online free of charge to all via the WFCCN website.

The associate editor roles are honorary positions and may be up to six in number, who are appointed by the Editors with input from the WFCCN Board for a 4-year term. Currently IJCC is poised to deliver 4 issues in 2024 and 2025 with ambitions to achieve PubMed Indexation in 2025. Requirements

- Fluent in the English Language
- Must have a reliable e-mail address
- Strong publication record and experience working with the professional editorial process
- Competent management and leadership skills and behaviour
- PhD or DNP preferred

Role

- Support and guide the Editors and the Managing editor, advisory board and peer reviewers
- Support the production of 4 issues per year with a minimum of 4 manuscripts per issue
- In consultation with the Editors advise on the strategic direction and content of the IJCC
- Peer review no less than 2 manuscripts per year and Guest Editor no less than one issue every 2 years
- Coordinate peer-review of articles with reviewers and provide mentorship to novice, low income and CALD authors writing for the IJCC
- Support authors with methods, manuscript structure and English language and grammar
