# Chasing Excellence Award Award Criteria

#### **Award Information**

Presented annually to a critical care nurse who consistently demonstrates excellence in critical care nursing practice.

\$ 1,000.00

## **Deadline**

June 1

## **Overall Award Criteria**

Refer to the CACCN Overall Award Criteria

## **Award Specific Criteria**

Applicants may be nominated or may self-identify.

The nominee must:

- 1. meet the CACCN Overall Award Criteria.
- 2. hold a primary role in direct patient care in critical care.
- 3. have a minimum of three (3) years of critical care nursing experience.
- 4. demonstrates nursing practice that is consistent with the CACCN Standards of Critical Care Nursing Practice (6th Ed. 2024);
- 5. holds Canadian Nurses Association certification CNCC(C) or CNCCP (C) in critical care (preferred).
- 6. have not been the recipient of this award in the past three years.

Revised 2025 Revised 2018 Created: 2009 The nominee/applicant must demonstrate a strong commitment to the practice of critical care nursing and the nursing profession through continuous learning, professional involvement, and a commitment to clinical expertise.

Registered nurses (RNs) in all aspects of critical care, including patient care providers, educators, Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS), may qualify for this award.

## **Submission Process**

Each application must be accompanied by the following:

- 1. One letter of support written and signed by a critical care nursing colleague who holds an active\* CACCN membership, in good standing.
- 2. One letter of support written and signed by critical care nursing leadership (unit supervisor, unit manager, team leader, clinical educator), or physician partner.
- 3. The nomination letters must <u>each describe a minimum of three</u> examples outlining how the nominee has met the award criteria and the nominee's clinical excellence and expertise.
- 4. Nomination letters may include a maximum of **one** similar / identical example supporting the applicant / nominee (i.e., nomination letters cannot be identical in nature)
- 5. Online submission at <a href="https://www.caccn.ca">www.caccn.ca</a>.
- 6. Incomplete packages, those not meeting the overall and award specific criteria and packages received via email will not be considered.

\*Active Member: Registered nurse working in critical care.

#### **Selection Process**

- 1. Each nomination will be reviewed and scored by an Awards Review Committee consisting of no less than three (3) and no more than five (5) active CACCN members;
- 2. The CACCN Board of Directors will notify the successful applicants via email and/or regular mail.
- 3. The successful nominee will be recognized at the Awards Ceremony at the Canadian Critical Care Nursing Conference (annually in the fall).
