## **Personal Statement**

My name is Marianne Rowland, and I am a Critical Care Nurse from Thorndale, Ontario.

I graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Toronto Metropolitan University in 2014 and began my nursing career at Woodstock Hospital that same year. Driven by a strong sense of curiosity and a desire to learn, I completed my Critical Care certificate at Conestoga College in 2019 and earned my Certificate in Nursing Education for the Practice Setting through the Lawrence Bloomberg Faculty of Nursing in 2023. I also obtained my CNA certificate in Critical Care Nursing in 2023. I am currently enrolled in the Master of Science in Nursing program at the University of Ottawa, in the thesis stream. My research focuses on the perceptions and experiences of nurses caring for critically ill patients in hospitals with allocated Level 2 basic critical care beds. I aim to explore what establishes a healthy and integrated healthcare system for critically ill patients in rural areas of Ontario.

Since 2018, I have been an active member of the London Regional Chapter of the Canadian Association of Critical Care Nurses (CACCN), where I have had the great pleasure of facilitating numerous educational events for chapter members.
