COST Action Project SAFE ICU (CA24017)

approved by the European Commission. The project was officially launched on 23 October 2025 in Brussels and will run for four years. This international network aims to advance patient safety through the **standardised measurement of three key patient safety outcomes**: pressure ulcers, healthcare-associated infections (HCAIs), and delirium. In addition, the project will investigate the processes contributing to the development of these conditions.
